<b>Tuition and fees related to academic program</b>	100%

<b>Summer Internship</b>	<p>Students must find a summer internship at an appropriate government employer. The CyberCorps SFS Program coordinates an annual job fair with dozens of participating federal government agencies where CyberCorps students can interview for both summer internship and permanent employment.</p> <p>In some cases, students are permitted to work for state, local, or tribal government agencies; national laboratories; or federally funded research and development centers.</p> <p>The CyberCorps SFS Program is committed to placing CyberCorps students into qualifying employment.</p>	
<b>Service Requirement (Upon Graduation)</b>	<p>Students must commit to one full year of government employment for each year or partial year on scholarship.</p> <p>The agency may be the same or different from the employer for the student's summer internship.</p>	
<b>Duration of scholarship</b>	<p>Up to 2 years for undergraduates or master's students</p> <p>Up to 3 years for doctoral studies or joint bachelors/masters programs</p>	
<b>Minimum GPA</b>	Undergraduate Students: Graduate/Doctoral Students:	3.0 3.2
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>United States citizens age 18 or older</p> <p>A rising university junior or higher</p> <p>Enrolled, accepted, or applied for full-time enrollment at GW with an undergraduate or graduate major in an area related to cybersecurity</p>	
<b>Program Requirements</b>	<p>Students must have applied and been accepted to GW to qualify.</p> <p>Students must be full time once awarded the scholarship. In the first year of study, outside employment is very limited.</p> <p>Students are expected to enroll in CS6534, Cybersecurity and Governance, each term; credit hours are given only for one such attendance.</p>	
<b>Application Deadline</b>	January 31st of each year	
<b>Pros and Cons of SFS</b>	<p>SFS pros: Unlimited choice of employment, slightly higher stipend and professional development allowance. More doctoral support options.</p> <p>SFS cons: Student must actively seek the internship and job placement.</p>

<b>Employment and Summer Internship</b>	<p>There are three major features of the CySP program</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Students are nominated by GW to U. S. Department of Defense (DoD), but DoD selects students based on billeting need.</li> <li>2) CySP students are assigned a summer internship AND a career position after graduation at the time of the scholarship award.</li> <li>3) CySP is a one year renewable scholarship</li> </ol>	
<b>Service Requirement (Upon Graduation)</b>	<p>Students must also commit to one full year of federal employment for each year or partial year on scholarship.</p> <p><u>The DoD employment is assigned at the time of scholarship award.</u></p>	
<b>Duration of scholarship</b>	<p>Up to 2 years for undergraduates or masters students</p> <p>Full-time doctoral students may be eligible on a case by case basis. Contact the principal investigator for an appointment to discuss.</p>	
<b>Minimum GPA</b>	Undergraduate Students: Graduate/Doctoral Students:	3.0 3.2
<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>United States citizens A rising university junior or higher Enrolled, accepted, or applied for full-time enrollment at GW with an undergraduate or graduate major in an area related to computer security and information assurance</p>	
<b>Program Requirements</b>	<p>Students must have applied and accepted to GW to qualify. Students must be full time once awarded the scholarship. In the first year of study, outside employment is very limited.</p> <p>Students are expected to enroll in CS6435, Cybersecurity and Governance at least once in their program.</p> <p>Complete service requirements, be willing to relocate if necessary</p>	
<b>Application Deadline</b>	January 15 for students starting or continuing at GW the following September	
<b>Pros and Cons of CySP</b>	<p>CySP pros: Students know when offered the award where they will intern/work.</p> <p>CySP cons: Slightly lower stipend and no specific professional development allowance</p>
